

Our biggest contributor of supplemental education funds is the Georgetown Island Education Foundation, or GIEF. GIEF donates over \$11,000 on a yearly basis under the Roschegan grant, the arts grant, the Telling Room, and After School Clubs.

We also apply for special grants through the state of Maine, such as the MOLI grant, and smaller grants, such as the MEEA science grant. Grant funding enables us to do many hands on project based learning. This year, the Davenport Fund granted us \$3,500.00 to support our before and after school child care program.
